 - * Focus on green fleet and driving the "top of the funnel"
 - * International Teams; CODA will continue to improve the planning and organization around Intl team formation. We will continue to strengthen the Intl Team Committee and get CODA more involved in managing the teams.
 - * Leverage our new relationship with Windathletes.ca donations to the class can now be funneled back to the sailors/coaches through CODA. Much more interesting for sponsors wanting to help develop our upcoming sailors -- We have raised \$16,000 over last 2 yrs for training and regattas (NAM).
